Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

I take my cue this most solemn weekend from a little book mostly unknown outside of priestly circles called "The Ordo." As you might guess, the name means "order." It means in this case the proper order for the Liturgy of the given day, in both the Liturgy of the Hours and the Mass. For this Palm Sunday, it tells the priest or deacon that "for pastoral reasons, one or both Readings before the Gospel may be omitted." In one sense, that is sad, owing to the appropriate beauty of today's first two Readings. But the Passion Narrative, this year from Matthew, has such central importance for Holy Week that it commands our focus.

Allow me to add that "pastoral reasons" may be a kind way of describing potential chaos and frayed tempers in the church parking lot as the Masses are longer than usual and the time between celebrations shortens. All things considered, it behooves the celebrant also to be brief with his homily. It may well be that his thoughts could interfere with those of the congregation.

My own handling of the matter is to invite the congregation to be seated (if they had been standing), relax and close their eyes (to be free of external distractions) and for a few minutes to think about what they just heard.

For the sake of brevity, then, I close these thoughts so that you can profit from your own. Have a spiritually profitable Holy Week.

Reading I: Isaiah 50: 4-7

The servant-prophet places his confidence in God, so that he can face any neglect, even the spittle on his face. Jesus did not shield His face from such insult.

Reading II: Philippians 2: 6-11

St. Paul quotes an early Church hymn that puts Christ's debasement in the context of His love and offers a haunting tribute to His humility. As it continues there is also a celebration of Christ's triumph.

The Gospel: Matthew 26: 14 -27: 66, or 27: 11-54

Closely following the account of Mark, Matthew expands on it with details that enrich our understanding of Christ's ordeal, in which He offers His life on the cross for us sinners.
