Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

"Are there any questions?" A stock query posed by teachers in classrooms everywhere. Depending on the age group, he or she may hear from a nervous child; or a sarcastic adolescent trying to be the class clown; or all the way up to the adult degree pursuer in a serious seminar. The silly ones are quickly dismissed. The sincere ones may set the whole class at ease as a false interpretation of the material could cause confusion. All said, the teacher must often practice patience answering questions about a matter long since explained but forgotten.

That last case exemplifies what Our Lord had to endure when one of His chosen, like Thomas or Phillip seem to be obtuse. I for one am impressed and edified by His patience. He knows He is working with uneducated simple men but who are also destined to be His messengers and saints.

First up is St. Thomas, already nicknamed for his many doubts. But we have to sympathize with him here when he asks the Lord: "How can we know the Way?" It's an understandable question. How Our Lord must have surprised Thomas when He answered "I am." Oh how often we keep looking elsewhere for the right road to eternal life. Not so much for the young among us who don't think much about their eternal future. We elders have to keep them from being duped by the latest pop philosophy. Or the preferred outlook of one of their college professors cleverly presented as the "only true way" at this crucial time of their lives. Or consider the instances where we adults prefer what is truly a form of darkness because it offers a convenient, secret way to contradict Christ, such as watching internet porn.

Next in line comes Phillip, another good soul, whom we have learned has become an appealing spokesperson of Christ to Greek-speaking people. He wants some clarification about this strange Person Jesus insists on calling "the Father." Jesus gives Phillip a clear and basic answer, the gist of which Phillip should have known by now after almost 3 years at Jesus' side. "If you have seen Me you have seen the Father." Again Jesus practices patience with Phillip. The answer he got has provided much food for thought and prayer for theologians and saints down through the centuries.

We must always remember in this context that doubt is not a sin. To question God in respectful prayer can enrich our belief. Those words we pray in the Nicene Creed each Sunday at Mass deserve research. The Bible comes first. But we also have the Catholic Catechism available in book form or online.

Our patience with ourselves as explorers coupled with patience with an inquiring person lends credence to the Good News.

We've been seriously considering two important questions, the answers to which enrich our spiritual lives. But there's always room for humor to allow a pause in our research. So I offer this story.

Once upon a time a man went to a fortune teller, hoping that she would be able to look into her crystal ball and make some stock market predictions. "My fee," said the fortune teller, "is one hundred dollars. For that amount you may ask two questions."

The client winced and said, "My, isn't that a lot of money for just two questions?" "Yes," the fortune teller replied. "Now what is your second question?"

Reading I: Acts 6: 1-7

The Greek-speaking Hellenists feel neglected by the Twelve. This creates a need for apostolic helpers. Thus are seven "reputable" men selected for the task of serving the whole community.

Reading II: I Peter 2: 4-9

The writer pictures the Church as a "spiritual household." Then he confers on it four titles that were once used of Israel in the Old Testament.

The Gospel: John 14: 1-12

Jesus calms the disciples' fear of death and then responds to Thomas' query about "the Way." Meanwhile, Phillip struggles to "see the Father." Jesus' response adds up to two important answers for us to remember.
