Week of July 2, 2023 The Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time



When I was 25, I had an opportunity to live in Chicago for 7 months as a youth minister for 3 different parishes. (It was the coldest winter I have ever experienced.) My mission and assignment was to recruit and train the youth ministers in those parishes. In order to gather young faithfuls, we needed a good cause. So we got in touch with the Vincentian Society to serve the poor and homeless at the homeless shelter and soup kitchen.

One day, while we were preparing the food to serve the dinner at the homeless shelter, a religious sister at the parish asked, "What do you guys do there?"

So I said, "Well, we set the food on the table, we serve them, and wait until they finish and we clean up and come home."

And the sister said, "That's great, but today, how about you guys make your own plates and sit with the homeless people and eat with them?"

The first time sitting around at the same table with those homeless people and eating with them was not easy. They were smelly and they looked scary. Their attitude was, "What are you doing? Why are you sitting with us? You are not one of us."

But after a few days, things began to change. They would prepare a place for me and wait for me to sit with them before they would begin to eat. And I began to hear them, their heart breaking life stories of how they became homeless. And I realized that when they were young, none of them said, "When I grow up, I am going to be homeless."

After the 7 months, when we had enough number of well-trained youth ministers in all 3 parishes, I was called to come back to New York.

So when I went to the shelter to say farewell, one of the homeless men said, "You have a home? I thought you were one of us."

I said, "I am one of you."

That is when I knew the importance and value of being there and being with them (them as the least of our Lord's brethren.) And that's when I knew the Lord was calling me to the priesthood.

That's why I thank God for this wonderful opportunity to be part of this Appalachian mission to Kentucky. Though they are not homeless, their living conditions are not any better that they may be the least of our Lord's brethren in this country.

I hope we will have a bigger number of participants from our parish in the future because we all know that the volunteers of these kind of projects always receive more than what we can ever offer.

For those of you who cannot participate, I ask your prayer and support. Thank you always for your generosity.

The Shunammite woman offers hospitality to Elisha the prophet with generosity and kindness. She does not yet know exactly who he is.

Reading II: Romans 6: 3-4, 8-11

The baptismal ritual represents the death, burial and resurrection of Christ. The convert to the Faith emerges as a new person, now living "for God in Christ Jesus."

The Gospel: Matthew 10: 37-42

Whoever receives an Apostle receives Christ. He insists that we take up our individual cross and follow Him, showing care for the needy as did the Shunammite woman.
