The rectory will be closed from Wednesday, November 27th to Friday, November 29th.




Marian Memorial Garden Dedication December 1st



An enduring tradition of the Church is the weekly lighting of the Advent wreath. Historians note that the precursor to our modern wreaths have been used since the Middle Ages. However, the first true recorded Advent wreath came from 19th century Germany.

The story goes that the children of a Lutheran congregation would ask their pastor daily how many days were left till Christmas. So one day he took a wagon wheel and mounted twenty-four candles to the rim. Starting on December 1st, the pastor and the children would light one candle each night until Christmas.

The custom caught on, eventually making its way to the Catholic Church.

The Advent wreaths available at the rectory are simple brass rings which can be a elegant statement piece on any table. However, our hope is that you will use it as an opportunity for your family to gather together and share the deeper meaning of our faith. We encourage you to take them home and decorate them, creating a new and lasting tradition in your domestic church.

Here are a few ideas on what to decorate your wreaths with, along with their symbolic meanings:

- Wreaths: The circular shape of the wreath itself symbolizes God's infinite love for us.
- Evergreens: Unlike other trees, evergreens such as pine and fir retain their leaves and color in every season. Like the circular wreath, this symbolizes God's everlasting love for us.
- Holly: Holly is an evergreen plant. Its sharp leaves remind us of the thorns on the crown forced on Jesus' head during his Passion, and the red berries represent the drops of his precious blood. It reminds us of the depth of Jesus' love, and how precious we are to him, that he was willing to suffer on our behalf.
- **Pinecones:** Did you know that there is a thirteen foot bronze pinecone in the courtyard of the Vatican Museum? Originating from evergreen trees, pinecones represent resurrection. Though they fall from the tree, it is from them that new life springs.

- Fruit: Fruits remind us of the twelve Fruits of the Holy Spirit—charity, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, generosity, gentleness, faithfulness, modesty, self-control, and chastity.
- Candy canes: This popular wintertime candy is shaped like a shepherd's crook, reminding us that Jesus is the Good Shepherd. The red represents his suffering and the white represents his purity. It is meant to be broken and shared, much like the Eucharist.
- **Bells:** The tinkling and ringing of bells represents joy.
- Angels: Angels are prominent in the story of Christ's birth. The angel Gabriel delivered the message of his incarnation to Mary and Joseph. After his birth, a host of angels appeared to the shepherds, singing Hosanna and announcing the arrival of the Savior. Angels are helpers and remind us that God is with us and that we should always sing praise to Him.
- Candles: Last, but certainly not least, are the candles. Each of the four candles represent a virtue, which we will discuss in the upcoming weeks. Overall, the candle is a reminder to us that Christ is the light of the world. Even in the darkness of winter, God provides a light by which we can find our way home

We hope that these visual reminders of the faith will draw you and your families into closer relationship with God.




