The Dedication of the Lateran Basilica November 9

Most Catholics think of St. Peter's as the Pope's main church, but it's actually St. John Lateran. The Archbasilica is the cathedra, or chair, of the bishop of Rome, who is the Pope.

St. John Lateran's is the oldest of the four Major Basilicas of Rome. When Emperor Constantine granted full liberty to Christians in 313, he constructed a church over the ancient Lateran Palace. It served as the residence of the Pope until 1870, when it was moved to the Vatican.

Originally, Pope Sylvester I dedicated it to Christ the Savior. When a baptistry was built in the 900s, Pope Sergius III dedicated it to Saint John the Baptist as well. Lastly, Pope Lucius II dedicated it to Saint John the Evangelist in the 12th century. Hence why the basilica bears the name St. John Lateran, owing to the two St. John's associated with Jesus. Its façade is crowned with colossal statues of Christ at the center, both St. John's on either corner, and the 12 doctors of the Church between them.

A Latin inscription in the Church reads: "omnium ecclesiarum Urbis et Orbis mater et caput." Translated, this means, "The mother and head of all churches of the city and of the world." Unlike the commemorations of other Roman churches, this anniversary is a feast. The dedication of a church is a feast for all its parishioners. In a sense, St. John Lateran is the parish church of all Catholics, because it is the pope's cathedral. This church is the spiritual home of the people who are the Church.

You need a license these days for so many things. That includes one for driving a car, truck, or bus. For hunting game, fishing for fish, or carrying a pistol, and for so many more of life's activities. Attached along with the license are bunches of regulations and penalties for ignoring them. But one doesn't need a license for practicing hypocrisy.

As truth itself, Our Lord was rightly repulsed by any instance of this, especially when He found it among religious leaders of His people. Today He offers a withering critique of the scribes and Pharisees for their hypocrisy.

On another occasion, He had called them "blind guides."

Today He urges the people in His audience to observe what they teach, but not how they acted. Why? Because "they preach but they do not practice."

I am at once sorry and ashamed upon pondering those words at the behavior of some of my brother priests who deserve that same rebuke. They brought great harm to many people, especially among the young, by their abuse of them. It remains an ongoing scandal. The late Benedict XVI succinctly described it as "filth" within the Church. It remains one of the devil's most successful efforts to harm the Church.

But today we hear Our Lord speak so powerfully about hypocrisy that could dwell in you and me. His assessment requires introspection on our parts. Have we, in some way or other, "preached" but not practiced? Have we given the young and not-so-young among us the kind of bad example that threatens their respect and love for the teachings of Christ and His Church? I think we do when we neglect our participation at the Mass, or we speak negatively about the pope or our pastor, who are our spiritual leaders. Our choice of TV shows. Our often-crude language. All habits that invite the young to imitate.

Our Lord offers a remedy; be humble. Recognize that true fidelity to God is shown by service of Him, followed by service to other people. Above all, to practice what you "preach" by your lifestyle.

A father once complained about the amount of time his family spent watching television. His children watched cartoons and neglected schoolwork. His wife preferred soap operas to housework. His solution?

"As soon as football season's over, I'm going to pull the plug."

God love you and give you His peace.
