The Advent season is a time of preparation that directs our hearts and minds to Christ's coming, both the anniversary of his birth on Christmas and his second coming at the end of time. Our Advent readings call us to be alert and ready, not weighted down and distracted by the cares of this world (Lk 21:34-36).

Like Lent, the liturgical color for Advent is purple since both are seasons that prepare us for great feast days. Advent also includes an element of penance in the sense of preparing, quieting, and disciplining our hearts for the full joy of Christmas. In our hearts we, "make straight the way of the Lord," as John the Baptist calls us to do in the Gospel. This is why we are encouraged to make the sacrament of Reconciliation during this season.

However, on the third Sunday of Advent, the color shifts to rose as we celebrate Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete comes from the Latin word for "rejoice." The name comes from the entrance antiphon which says, "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near."

We are more than halfway through Advent and the tone shifts to one of joyful anticipation as Jesus draws near to us and we draw near to him. In the first reading, Isaiah exhorts us to "rejoice heartily in the LORD." The prophet continues, "in my God is the joy of my soul; for he has clothed me with a robe of salvation." This celebration is a reminder that we await the Lord's coming not with fear, but with tremendous joy, for Jesus approaches, bringing mercy, hope and eternal joy for those who are faithful.



A Word from the Pastor *Marian Hymns*

Once, I was asked why our parishioners at Sacred Heart do not say the prayer to St. Michael after daily Masses. I said, "Because we pray Hail Holy Queen in honor of our blessed mother who gave birth to our Savior." It is a wonderful tradition to pray to St. Michael after the Mass, but I believe it is a better tradition to sing the Marian Hymns after each celebration of Communion.

One of the principle Dogmatic Constitution documents of Vatican II, the Lumen Gentium ends like this:

In the interim just as the Mother of Jesus, glorified in body and soul in heaven, is the image and beginning of the Church as it is to be perfected is the world to come, so too does she shine forth on earth, until the day of the Lord shall come, as a sign of sure hope and solace to the people of God during its sojourn on earth.

It gives great joy and comfort to this holy and general Synod that even among the separated brethren there are some who give due honor to the Mother of our Lord and Savior, especially among the Orientals, who with devout mind and fervent impulse give honor to the Mother of God, ever virgin. The entire body of the faithful pours forth instant supplication to the Mother of God and Mother of men that she, who aided the beginnings of the Church by her prayers, may now, exalted as she is above all the angels and saints, intercede before her Son in the fellowship of all the saints, until all families of people, whether they are honored with the title of Christian or whether they still do not know the Savior, may be happily gathered together in peace and harmony into one people of God, for the glory of the Most Holy and Undivided Trinity.

Seasonally, we can sing Salve Regina, Alma Redemptoris Mater, Ave Regina Caelorum and Regina Caeli throughout the Liturgical year. Though these hymns may sound like we are praising Our Lady, they are not praise directed to her, but they are her praise of how God has blessed her. And all these sung prayers to Our Blessed Mother are asking her to intercede with Jesus on our behalf and to bring us closer to him.

So as we begin the new year, we will sing these Marian Hymns after all Sunday Masses.
