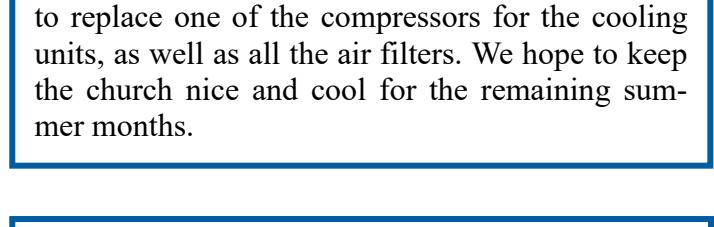

2023 Capuchin Appalachian Mission Report

On Saturday, July 8th, the Capuchin Appalachian Mission (CAM) participants began our journey to Harlan Kentucky by gathering at Sacred Heart School. We started by loading donations, tools and supplies and then participated in a commissioning service inside Sacred Heart Church. After a meal with some of our supporters, we loaded up into 4 passenger vans and began our overnight trek to Holy Trinity Church in Harlan. The days were full of ministry and our evenings were full of prayer, community and theological reflection. Our outreach team bought and distributed a large number of backpacks to children who could not afford school supplies. We also put together bags of household supplies for needy families, along with the 85 boxes of clothing donations. All supplies were distributed, and with some extra funding raised, the team were able to buy specific items like shoes for children in need. The manual labor teams built and repaired decks, ramps and stairs to improve some houses and mobile homes in substandard conditions. The vacation bible school team provided a fun, safe and inspiring week for local children, while providing a free lunch for those in need. One of the Catholic mothers told us that her children are the only Catholics in their school, so seeing the teen missionaries inspire them to be proud of their faith and help them feel as they belong. Our senior ministry visited people at a local nursing home who do not receive many visitors, providing activities, music and laughter. Some residents of the nursing home live there due to issues associated with aging, and some are former coal miners, as young as in their 40's and 50's, who have job-related injuries or illnesses that require 24-hour nursing care. Our hospitality ministry lovingly prepared meals for our community and made sure we were well nourished and cared for. Each evening, we celebrated Mass or Adoration and reflected on our ministries and how God is calling us to grow in our faith and respond to our brothers and sisters.

This week was definitely tiring, challenging and relentless but so rewarding. CAM 2023 pushed me in new ways to grow in my faith and spirituality, and to recognize some hard truths about real inequity and poverty in our country. But I also saw so much hope, grit, determination, and faith in people working to make a better community for their brothers and sisters. I had the honor to facilitate the outreach ministry with 11 other people, giving out donated clothing, school supplies, backpacks and cleaning supplies to people in Harlan, KY. I also coordinated music ministry for the missionaries during daily Mass and prayer services. It was a wonderful opportunity to support the Harlan community and minister to our "CAM fam" of 44 missionaries from across the country. I was incredibly proud to go again with Annaliese and Amelia Montero, who brought their father Armindo along; with my wife Emily Goldwasser and her parents, and for the first time ever, my niece Abby. And I'm very grateful for Fr. Michael Moon participating as well and generously offering Sacred Heart as the "hub" before and after the mission. I realize that intergenerational poverty is a hard truth that must be faced, but intergenerational service helps provide some hope that one day we will make this world a better, more just and loving one.

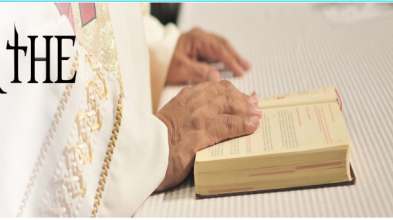
